ISSUED AT 11:00 PM, 08 November 2020

TROPICAL DEPRESSION "TONYO" SLIGHTLY INTENSIFIES WHILE MOVING OVER THE WEST PHILIPPINE SEA.

Track and Intensity Outlook

Tropical Depression "TONYO" is forecast to continue moving westward and is likely to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility tomorrow morning. Intensification into tropical storm is likely within the next 24 hours.

Hazards affecting land areas

Heavy rainfall: Tonight through tomorrow, "TONYO" is forecast to bring moderate to heavy rains over Kalayaan Islands. The tail-end of a cold front (shear line) associated with the Northeast Monsoon enhanced by "TONYO" will bring moderate to heavy rains over mainland Cagayan Valley, Cordillera Administrative Region, and Aurora. Light to moderate with at times heavy rains will be experienced over Ilocos Region, the rest of Central Luzon, Batanes and Babuyan Islands.

Flooding (including flashfloods and rain-induced landslides may occur during heavy or prolonged rainfall especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards and/or those that received significant antecedent rainfall. PAGASA Regional Services Divisions may issue local thunderstorm/rainfall advisories and heavy rainfall warnings while the Hydrometeorology Division and River Basin Flood Forecasting and Warning Centers may issue General Flood Advisories and Basin Flood Bulletins as appropriate.


Strong winds: Although not under Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal #1, the outer region of the tropical depression's circulation will bring occasional gusty condition over the Kalayan Islands. Meanwhile, the Northeast Monsoon enhanced by "TONYO" will bring strong to gale-force winds over Batanes, Babuyan Islands, Ilocos Norte, Apayao, and the northern portion of mainland Cagayan.

Hazards affecting coastal waters

In the next 24 hours, rough to very rough seas will be experienced over the seaboard of Kalayaan Islands (2.5 to 4.5 m) due to "TONYO" and over the seaboard of Batanes, Babuyan Islands, Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, La Union, Pangasinan, and Zambales and the northern seaboard of mainland Cagayan (2.5 to 5.0 m) due to the enhanced Northeast Monsoon. **Sea travel is risky over these waters, especially for those using small seacrafts.**

"TONYO" will also bring moderate to rough seas (1.5 to 2.5 m) over the western seaboard of Bataan, Batangas, Occidental Mindoro including Lubang Island, and Palawan including Calamian Islands. Mariners of small seacrafts are advised to take precautionary measures when venturing out to sea. **Inexperienced mariners should avoid navigating in these conditions.**

Location of eye/center	At 10:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Depression "TONYO" was estimated based on all available data at 395 km West of Calapan City, Oriental Mindoro (12.7°N, 117.6°E) .
Strength	Maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 70 km/h .
Movement	Moving Westward at 30 km/h .
